Expect respect

The song '*Beat the Rap*' ends with the words:

*If authorities show you no
respect
You have a right to complain
and to object
Expect to be treated with respect*

Many problems can be sorted out by respectful communication. This should be from all sides. You should give respect to authorities and try to understand the position they are in and the pressures they face. Authorities, equally, should treat you with respect.

If you don't get respect then you have rights to make complaints against authorities.

If police don't treat you fairly and politely you have the right to complain to the officer in charge of the police station, to the Commissioner of Police or the Crime and Misconduct Commission, which is not part of the police service (this is in Queensland).

If lawyers don't treat you with respect you can complain to the local Law Society or lawyer's ethics body

In court you can complain to the magistrate or judge. If you don't think your case was fair you may be able to appeal to a higher court. You would need legal advice before going ahead.
