Bee and Jay met in Australia.


This is a story about family life and family law in Australia.

She slammed the door behind her.


Bee ran to Jay and told him what her parents had said.

One day, Kayelle fell out of the cot.




Kayelle's face was badly bruised so Bee took her to the hospital but the doctor said that she was okay.

But I am the man! I should work and you should stay at home and look after Kayelle!




After a long silence, Jay said,

Maybe you can go to counselling services together. They can help you to talk about your problems.


Finally, Bee and Kayelle went home to Jay. He was very happy to see his wife and daughter. He gave them both a hug to welcome them.

I'm so happy you came home. I was very worried. I'm so sorry for what I did. I promise it won't happen again. I don't want to lose either of you. I love you!




Bee and Jay talked for a long time then agreed to go to counselling.

I'm not doing anything wrong!



A security guard caught the group and called the police.




When the police arrived, they called Jay so he left work and hurried to the shopping centre. The police questioned Kayelle then gave her a caution.
