

Most domestic and family violence is by men. Research shows a lot of this is done by men to believe men should be able to dominate women. It's sometimes called 'male entitlement' or 'toxic masculinity'. Sometimes the violence is because of anger and learning to manage anger is an important skill to learn. But the need to change attitudes about 'male entitlement or superiority' and to support gender equality is highly important.
